2005	Slide process for new artists was used again. Over 800 pieces were submitted to the jury.
2006	Instituted slide, e-mail process for the submission of art to the jury. Over 1000 images

were received. Developed a fixed price wall sale for the Thursday evening Museum Reception. 74 pieces were accepted into the inaugural fixed price sale – entitled the Russell Roundup.

2007 Nearly 1,000 images were submitted to the auction jury. 297 pieces were accepted to the live auction and 88 pieces were accepted for the Russell Roundup (the Thursday evening fixed price wall sale).
